What to bring

*Resume* (bring 2 copies per company you plan to speak with)

Your resume should be specific and targeted.

Two key areas are the <u>objective / profile summary</u> and the <u>first job</u> listed. Make sure it is direct and to-the-point.

*Letters of Recommendation* (bring 3 copies per company) *Portfolio* (leather or vinyl-bound portfolio to hold resumes etc.)

*Briefcase* (more "professional look" to store literature than a plastic bag)

*Dress* (image is crucial, dress "business casual" with comfortable shoes)
