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- ❖ Honors Course Prerequisite: At the June 2nd meeting, the chair of the Honors Institute Course Prerequisite Ad Hoc Committee, Scott Lankford, presented a report from the committee. The presentation described the committee's process and findings and, most importantly, made five recommendations to CCC:
 - 1. Eliminate the current "Honors Institute participant" prerequisite, which is currently listed on and enforced for all Foothill honors courses
 - 2. Add a standard course description "footnote" to all Foothill honors courses
 - 3. Use established criteria from the UCLA Transfer Alliance Program (TAP) as a guideline for standardizing Foothill honors courses
 - 4. Add additional Methods of Evaluation to all Foothill honors courses
 - 5. Design a student course evaluation similar to the rubric used by Los Medanos College
