The big topic of discussion at the October 17th meeting was led by Articulation Officer Evan Gilstrap, who presented a helpful introduction to upcoming changes resulting from the AB 928 legislation. This law mandates the creation of a singular transfer GE pathway, which will be the sole GE option for students earning an ADT. You may have heard of this new pathway, called CalGETC—it goes into effect fall 2025. The law also requires community colleges to begin auto-enrolling students into an ADT pathway if the student declares a major which offers an ADT—this requirement goes into effect August 1st, 2024. Students may opt out of the auto-enrollment process, and as mentioned it applies only to majors for which an ADT exists (for example, it applies to English but not to Engineering).

The move to CalGETC will be a major undertaking for colleges across the state, and the state-wide implementation plan is still being developed. Expect to hear more from Evan and/or your CCC Reps as more information becomes available.
