Dear Colleagues,

We are writing to you as the senate-appointed team to the media liaison effort between the Foothill Academic Senate and Foothill College President Thuy Nguyen to share some unfortunate developments that occurred last week in the relationship between the senate and President Nguyen. It pains us to report to you that the formal media liaison between the Foothill Academic Senate and President Nguyen has broken down completely.

To review, the "media liaison effort" was one of nine bundled strategies proposed by the senate [last spring](#) to address the serious and growing concerns being brought forward by Foothill faculty to the senate. This letter documented a pattern under President Nguyen's administration of faculty input into important decisions on campus being ignored or never heard, even on matters for which state law and regulations along with FHDA Board Policy requires the college to consult with the academic senate.

In mid-May, President Nguyen contracted Mr. Wally Anderson as mediator. Despite this media liaison team's willingness to come to the table even during the summer months, the media liaison process experienced many delays including: repeated delays scheduling meetings with President Nguyen and her cabinet; the unilateral withdrawal and subsequent return to media liaison by Po Thi An, President Nguyen

our agreement with the mediator's conclusion, and do not see a path forward given the past actions and present words of President Nguyen.

We find the delays in moving this forward and, even more importantly, the timing of President Nguyen's sudden display of investment in this process, after months of attempts for us to move forward, as confusing, erratic and most importantly not conducive to building trust that is essential for successful media on. Furthermore, upon review of President Nguyen's objectives document, the Senate media on team is even more steadfast in our position that it would not be productive to restart media on. The objectives document puts forth a narrative of the conflict between the Senate and President Nguyen that we, the media on team, reject as unsubstantiated, false, and insulting. In this document, we find the implication that our college and our students would be better off if the faculty's roles and responsibilities in college governance and decision-making were reduced absurd and categorically unacceptable. As faculty, we are engaged in the work of teaching and supporting students every day, and our input on academic and professional matters is essential to the success of students and the mission of Foothill College.

As a faculty, collectively and individually, we now stand on a precipice. We are going to have to decide how to address President Nguyen's problematic narrative and attacks on the foundational principles of our college and its learning environment. These will be the conversations the senate must address in the days and weeks to come. We urge you, the Foothill College faculty, no matter your position on this issue, to engage in this conversation, and let your voice be heard.
