Dear Colleagues,

We are wring to you as the senate-appointed team to the media one ort between the Foothill Academic Senate and Foothill College President Thuy Nguyen to share some unfortunate developments that occurred last week in the relaonship between the senate and President Nguyen. It pains us to report to you that the formal mediaon between the Foothill Academic Senate and President Nguyen otrality has broken down completely.

To review the "media one ort" was one of nine bundled strategies proposed by the senate <u>last spring</u> to address the serious and growing concerns being brought forward by Foothill faculty to the senate. This le er documented a pa ern under President Nguyen's administra on of faculty input into important decisions on campus being ignored or never heard, even on ma ers for which state law and regula ons along with FHDA Board Policy requires the college to consult with the academic senate.

In mid-May, President Nguyen contracted Mr. Wally Anderson as mediator. Despite this media on team's willingness to come to the table even during the summer months, the media on process experienced many delays including: repeated delays scheduling mee ngs with President Nguyen and her cabinet; the unilateral withdrawal and subsequent return to media on by Po Thi a offen beg esident Nguy

our agreement with the mediator's conclusion, and do not see a path forward given the past ac ons and present words of President Nguyen.

We find the delays in moving this forward and, even more importantly, the ming of President Nguyen's sudden display of investment in this process, a er months of a empts for us to move forward, as confusing, erra c and most importantly not conducive to building trust that is essen al for successful media on. Furthermore, upon review of President Nguyen's objectives document, the Senate media on team is even more steadfast in our position that it would not be productive to restart media on. The objectives document puts forth a narral velof the conflict between the Senate and President Nguyen that we, the media on team, reject as unsubstantated, false, and insuling. In this document, we find the implication on that our college and our students would be being if the faculty's roles and responsibilities in college governance and decision-making were reduced absurd and categorically unacceptable. As faculty, we are engaged in the work of teaching and supporting students every day, and our input on academic and professional materials every also the success of students and the mission of Foothill College.

As a faculty, collec vely and individually, we now stand on a precipice. We are going to have to decide how to address President Nguyen's problema c narra ve and a acks on the founda onal principles of our college and its learning environment. These will be the conversa ons the senate must address in the days and weeks to come. We urge you, the Foothill College faculty, no ma er your posi on on this issue, to engage in this conversa on, and let your voice be heard.
