1993-2021: cohort size of 60 students
30 high school juniors and 30 seniors

PAUSD - (Palo Alto Unified School District)

 New Campus Center 2007 was designed with space for 50-60 Middle College Students



Expansion and Relocation



2021- now: cohort 100+ students

- Recommended units per term is 7-11 (average is 9 units)
- Students are taking 7 15 units.
- Due to the increase in number of students served Middle College moves to 5700 in 2022-23.

PAUSD Middle College High School

- 2024-25: 60 sophomores and 60 juniors (120 students)
- 2025-26 and beyond: 60 sophomores, 60 juniors and 60 seniors (total of 180 students)
- Students will take 7-11 units (anticipate 9 average units)

MVLA Middle College @ 100 students

- Relocation costs = \$39,000 x 50% =
 \$19,500
- Space costs = 2019 sf x \$48 = \$96,912
- Utilities = ????
- Estimated Revenue = \$371,566

Revenue Calculation: 100 students x 9hrs x 11.67 weeks x 3 quarters/525 hrs x \$6,191

PAUSD Middle College @ 120 & 180 students

- Relocation costs = \$31,000 x 50% = \$15,500
- Space Costs = 1423 sf x \$48 = \$68,304
- Utilities = ????
- Estimated Revenue 120 students = \$445,879
- Estimated Revenue 180 students = \$668,819
