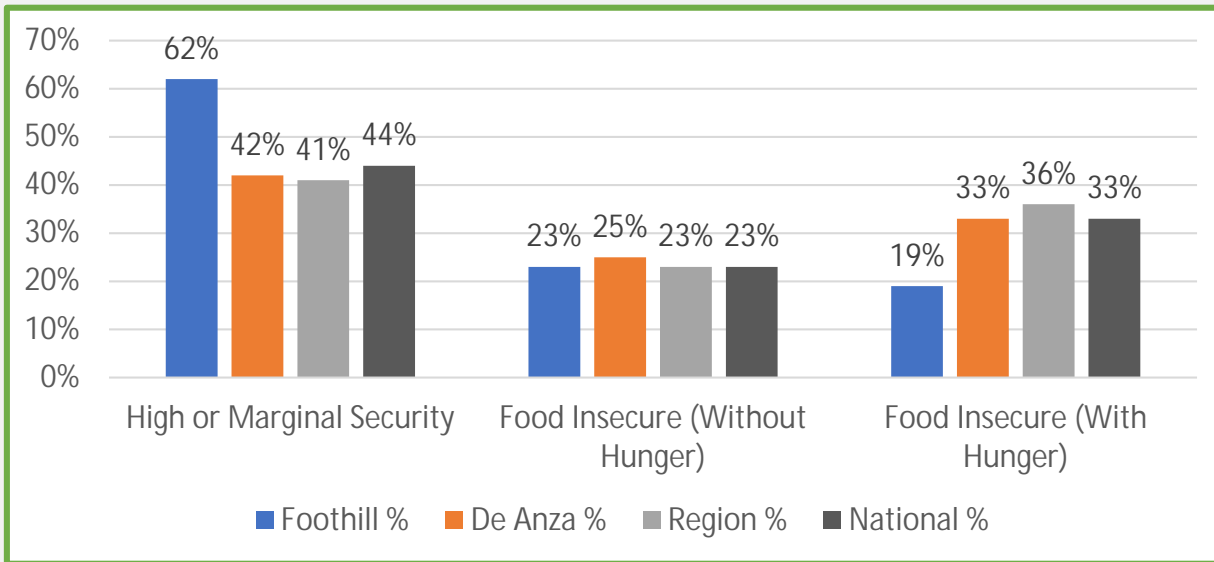
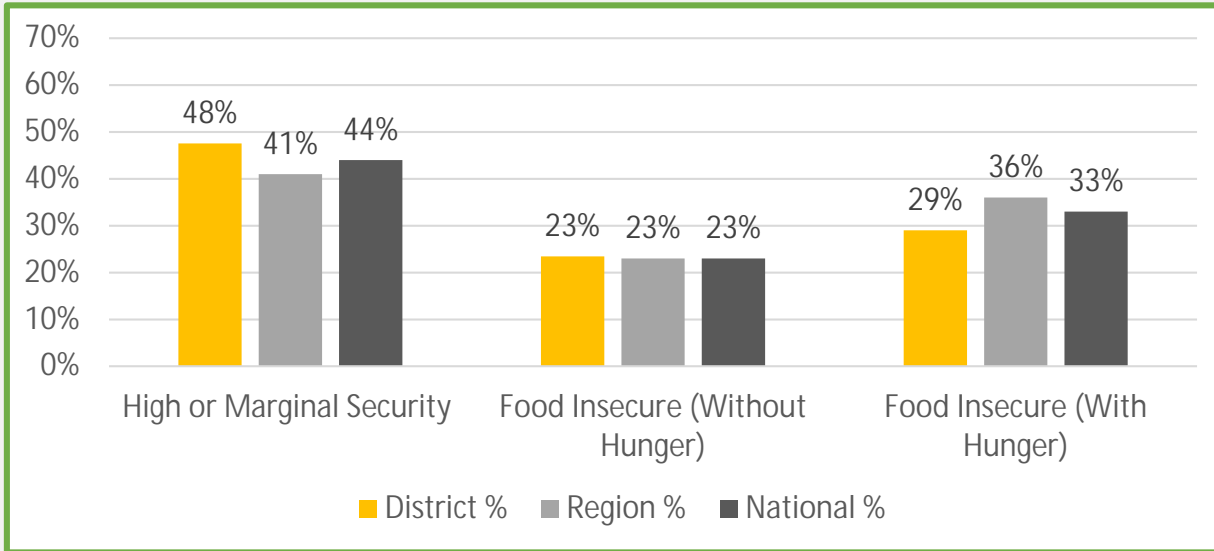
- Rates of insecurity among Foothill-De Anza respondents were high in all four categories

Food Insecurity



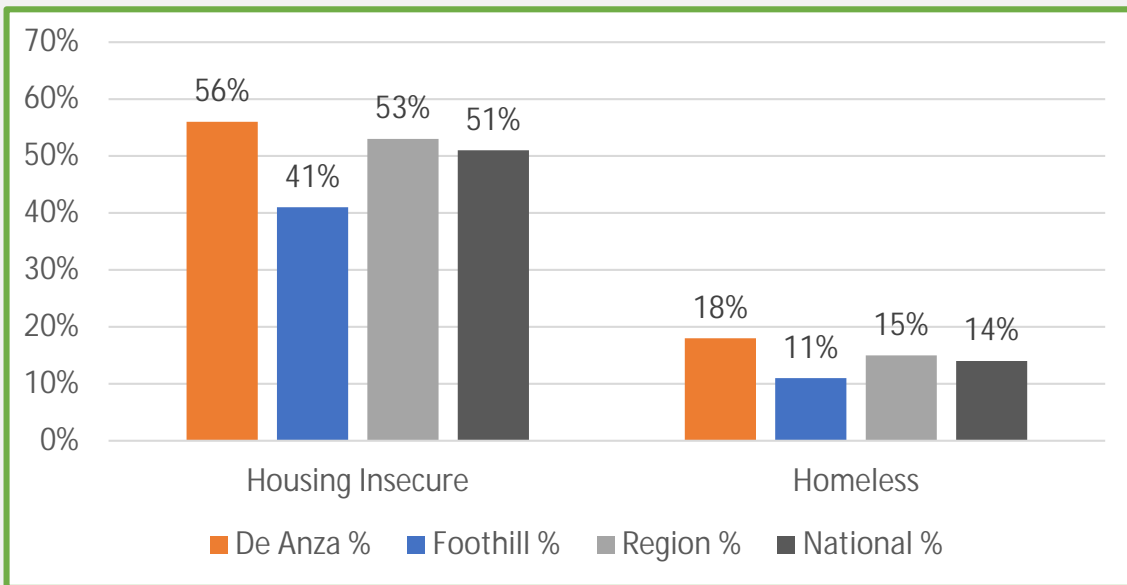
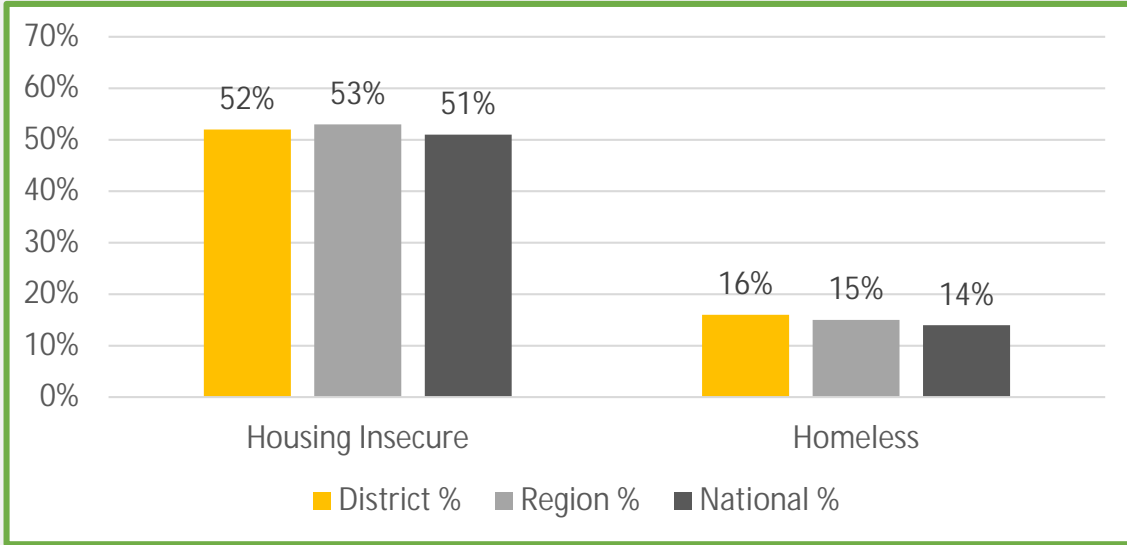
Highest Rates of Affirmative Responses (past 12 months):

- (31% De Anza; 20% Foothill)

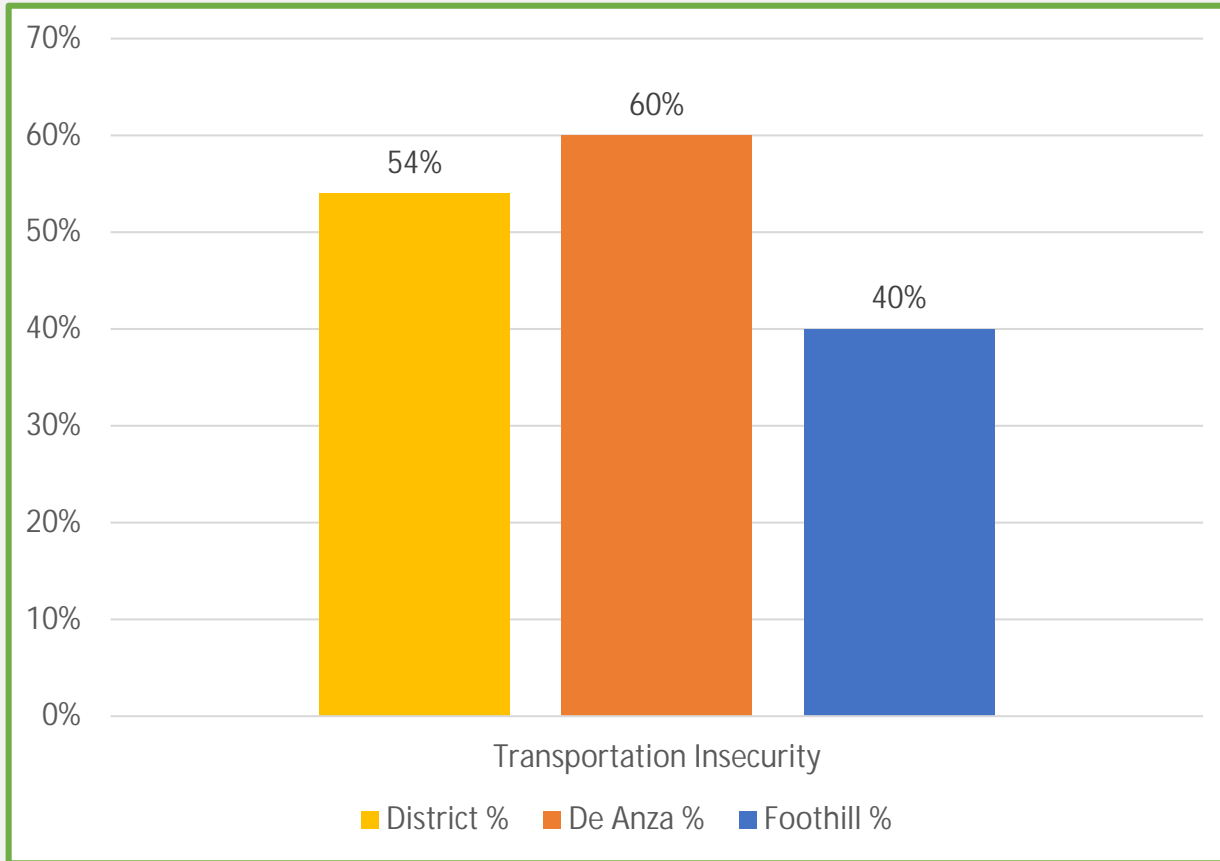
Highest Rates of Affirmative Responses to Homelessness Items (past 12 months):

- (11% De Anza; 9% Foothill)



Transportation Insecurity



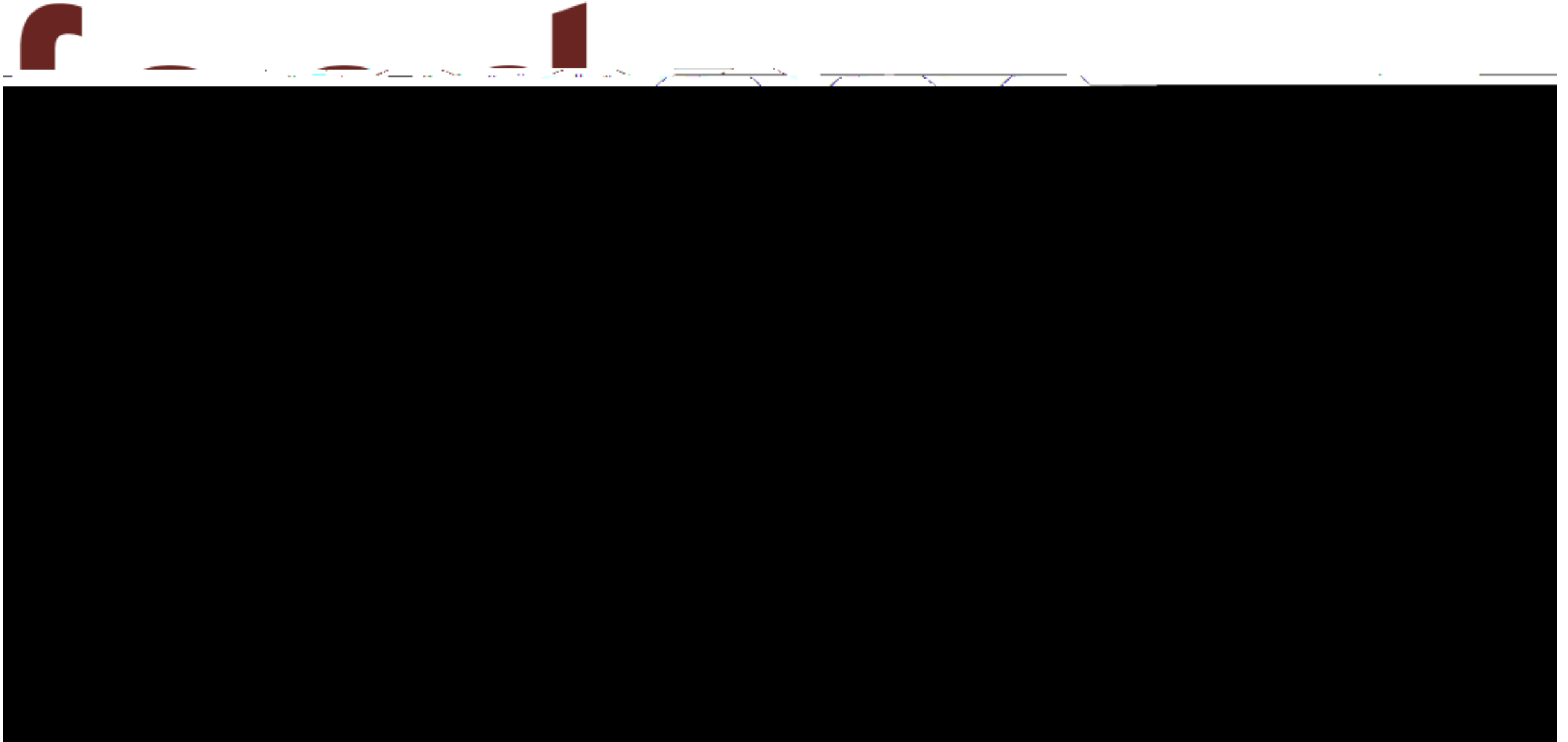

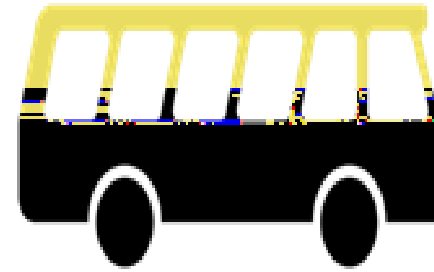
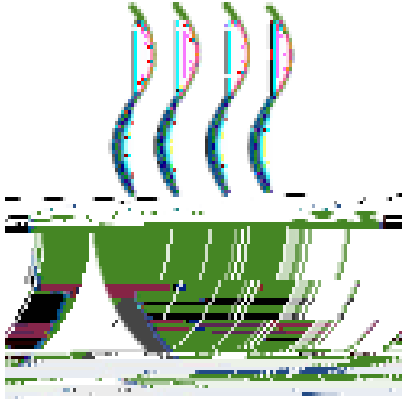
