



## Dear Colleagues,

The Parliament is excited at the prospect of a COVID-19 vaccine being approved within a few weeks and, if all goes well, that we might be able to look at reasonable timelines for returning to campus. Having said that, it is important to note that the COVID-19 emergency accelerated the adoption of new technologies and prompted our already innovative campus to do even more phenomenal work. The apprenticeship program's transition to virtual learning (please see below) is just another example of this innovation!

The last revision of the college's <u>Equity 2.0 plan</u> was released on Nov. 25. If you have not done so already, please read the plan, and get involved in the various campus-wide discussions as we look to operationalize it.

Check out the governance updates every week to see the important work our councils are doing. They have been busier than ever and are making recommendations on everything from service leadership to the creation of a fifth, temporary council (the Emergency Operations Council) to help the college navigate the return to campus discussion. Our governance councils are doing important work! Please join the regular meetings as your schedule allows and get involved. done on service leadership and asking the group if they would like to continue working with Colber. A motion was put forward to create a study group to formally articulate the definition and scope of service leadership as well as adopting it as an integrated aspect of the Foothill College community.

Institutional Research gave an update on the governance assessment. The survey was released on Monday, Nov. 30, and will be open until Wednesday, Dec. 9. Interviews will be conducted in February and the report is due in May.

An extra meeting for drafting a response to the <u>Open Letter to Foothill College</u> <u>Governance</u> was scheduled for Wednesday, Dec. 2, with an emphasis on having a response ready by the Dec. 11 deadline.

The Research and Service Leadership Symposium Coordinators, **A**and **C**, formally requested professional development credit for activities related to the RSLS, including attending and facilitating workshops, mentoring students, and moderating Symposium sessions during the event. They proposed considerations be made for compensating adjunct faculty and classified staff for their time and efforts. The council voted in favor of making this recommendation to the president.

**C** gave an update on the Facilities Master Plan Work Group. The group has been working with Gensler in order to prioritize needs for Measure G spending. Some updates included increasing usage of Sunnyvale Campus as well as a reimagining of Foothill's main campus spaces. For example, access points to campus, rideshare drop off places, empty spaces behind the football field, etc. A survey was recently released to help prioritize spending.

C&C will meet again on Dec. 11 at 2 p.m.

## Revenue & Resources

The R&R Council met on Dec. 4 and had an intense and fruitful discussion to come to a decision about the return to campus process. The council voted in favor of the formation of a fifth governance council focused on the return to campus plan with more decision making to come about the composition of the council to ensure full representation across the college. The group also sent off Denise Perez (tri-chair) and Sara Cooper (faculty rep) who are both stepping down from the council, to be replaced by Phuong Tran and Kathy Perino in the winter. We thank them for their service as active members of the R&R Council.

Chris Allen, Dean of Apprenticeship Programs, recently wrote an article about the transition to virtual learning.



The photographers, whose work is on display in the KCI Gallery, have used the camera to not only capture the memories of cultures and people around the world,




but also as a catalyst for achieving tolerance and respect. Register on Eventbrite.


