#### **ACCOUNT SET UP**

All users need to set up or verify their accounts. Even if you think you have an account, this is an important first step – your account may not be the free Pro account provided by CCC. A Pro account allows you to have unlimited participants and unlimited time in your conferences.

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### Connecting with Canvas

Once you're sure your conferzoom.org account is established, you can easily connect with Canvas.

- 1. Go to your course in Canvas.
- 2. Click Settings
- 3. Click the Navigation tab at the top of vour screen.
- Scroll down and find ConferZoom. Click the three vertical dots to the right of the name and Enable.
- Update your settings (bottom of the screen).
- Click Home. You should now see ConferZoom in your course navigation.
- 7. Select ConferZoom. Does it recognize you? Do you see your name in the upper right corner? Do you see the Schedule and Quick Launch buttons? If not, click Account Settings to the right of your name, then Conferencing Accounts. If you don't see the option to associate your account, return to the previous page and contact Conferzoom support.

- Students will see the lectures and be able to join by clicking on ConferZoom. Students may need to download the plug in and will be prompted to do so before joining a scheduled session.
