Instead, for disciplines in which a student needs multiple opportunities to gain skill (such as studio arts or PE) we will be permitted to offer up to four levels of a topic. For example: Beginning Spelunking, Intermediate Spelunking, Advanced Spelunking, and Uber -Elite -Professional Competition -Spelunking. None of the individual courses can be repeated. Though not yet official, the elimination of repeatability is expected to hit us next Spring/Summer. (\*If you do NOT know who you are, but suspect you should, call Cori/Carolyn/Kimberlee.)
