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RE: Honors Enrollment and Demographics

Overview

Students who are cleared for the Honors Institute in the 2032 academic year were identified to determine enrollment in honors courses a student characteristics such as ethnicity, age and F1 status. Clearance for the Honors Institute requires a minimum GPA of 3.3 and completion of ENGL 1A with at least B' grade While 416 students are currently in the Honors Institute, 104 students did not enroll in any course (Honors or not Honors) during the 2012-13 academic year (25%). It is likely the majority of these students may have transferred to a four-year institution, but the exact reasons for lack of enrollment are unknown. Refer to tables 14 for additional data.

Highlights:

- Almost onequarter of students with honors clearance are F1 students (23%), and F1 students account for roughly 40% of students enrolled in honors courses during 2012 (38%).
- While students between the ages of 20 and 24 accounted for 36% of Fall 2012 enrollment, this age group accounts for 62% of the students in the Honors Institute.
- Among Honors Institute students, younger students (age 19 or less) exhiro that honors cours at a higher percentage rate while they compose 21% of Honors Institute students, they make up 32% of Honors course enrollment.
- Asian students account for almost half of the Honors Institute students (48%).
- Asian and White students account for nearly thousanters of the students leared for the Honors Institute (48% and 29%) and among those who enrolled in Honors courses during 201213 (45% and 28%).
- Almost 70% of Latino/a Honors Institute students enrolled in an Honors course during 2012-13 (68%). This rate is the highest compute all other ethnicities (e.g. roughly half of the Asian and White Honors Institute students enrolled in an Honors e46% and 48%). Note that only three out of the eight African American Honors Institute students enrolled in an Honors course this demic year (39%).

Methodology

Honors Institutestudents were identified using the Student Cohort table; however, because some students were initially cleared for the program through the Student Attribute table during the migration to the Banner stem in 2010, students with ids beginning in the 200s were also identified as current Honors Institute members. Honor course enrollment was determined based on courses ending with "H."
