RE: Spring 2012 Course Enrollment

Overview

Students enrolled in Spring 2012 were identified to determine their course load. Table 1 shows the attempted course units in relation to the number of courses taken. The majority of students are enrolled part-time in 1-3 courses that are between 3.0-5.9 units (34%). Of the full-time students (3087), those attempting 12.0 units or more, roughly 60% are enrolled in 1-3 courses.

Methodology

Students enrolled in a course during Spring 2012 were identified based on registration codes, including re-add course, registered and web registered. Those students who dropped or withdrew from a course were excluded. Students taking APPR, CWE, DANC, JYRM, LiNC, NC, PA, PC and PHED courses were also excluded. The total number of courses as well as the number of attempted units was summed for each student.
