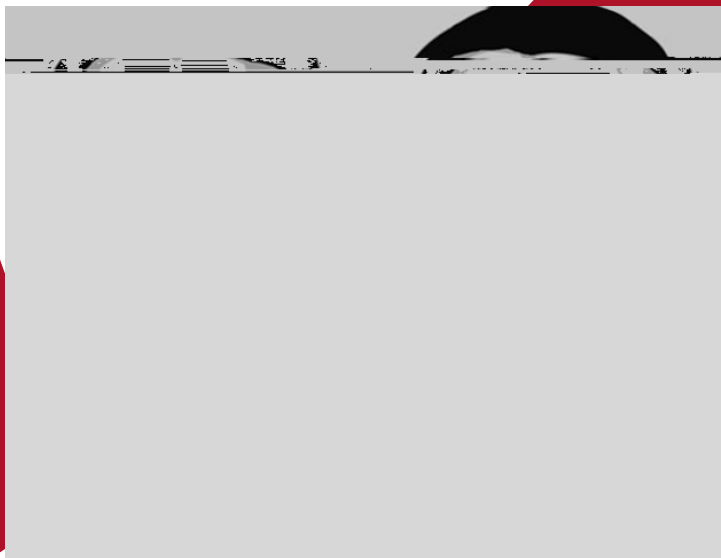
Winter Matters
