The deadline to file taxes is Tuesday, April 18. Don't wait until the last minute! You could be eligible for free tax-filing assistance through the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program. Visit irs.treasury.gov/freetaxprep for a list of providers near you. You may also be eligible for the California Earned Income Credit or the federal Income Tax Credit.
