Career & Technical Education (CTE) Employment Outcomes Survey 2016 Foothill College

Background


Skillsbuilding students from Foothill Collegevere surveyed if they met one of the following criteria in 20132014, and did not enroll in 2012015: earned a certificate of 6 or more units, earned a vocational degree, or earned 9+ CTE units. The survey was administered in early2016by email, telephone and US mail. The survey addressed student perceptions of their CTE programe, mployment outcomes, and how their coursework and training relate to their current career.

A total of 2050 students were surveyed art 33 unduplicated student sesponded 99 of whom responded by email (18.6%),351 by telephone (65.9%) and 83(15.6%) by US Mail, for a total overall response rate of 26%.

Results

{ Respondents were asked thereimary reason for studying atFoothill Collegeand the majority (44.7%) indicated earning a certificate or degree (with or without transfer). Figure 1 shows the results.

{ 52.7% of former students were "very satisfied" with the education and training they received at Foothill Collegeand 36.4% were "satisfied" for an overall satisfaction rate **df**9.1%.

{ 30.8% of respondents indicated they had transferred to another College or University.
